




What they also find is a slower pace and often a soft and welcoming southern drawl. Take a moment to get to know the people while you are here. Often you will find they, too, are

# Beaches and "Bushwackers":

## Michigan couple finds the best of all worlds in their RV

Two-week family Gulf Coast spring break trips in the 1990s fed Joan and Bob Jansma's desire to escape Michigan's harsh winters when it came their time to retire. Little did they know that Joan eventually would become president of the Michigan Snowbird Club, the largest of Alabama's 11 state clubs which boasted 996 members in 2017.

The couple hails from recreation-rich Fremont, Mich., located in the state's southwest corner and about 30 miles from the white sandy beaches of Lake Michigan. They are the parents of three children: Paul, 50, who lives in Oregon; Andrew, 47, of Fremont and Libby, 44, of Atlanta, Ga. They have five grandchildren ranging in age from 7-11.

The Jansma's followed the tradition of other Fremont residents who began migrating to the Perdido Key, Flaarea in the 1970s with many staying at the Sundowner Condominiums. The condos are within walking distance of the famed southern "Road House" bar, the gulf-front Flora-Bama where the Jansma's and others would regularly meet to enjoy live music from favorite artists such as Lea Anne Creswell and to toast sunsets. Their favorite cocktail is Gulf Coast specialty the "Bushwacker" a creamy concoction of rum, Baileys Irish

Cream, Kahlua, ice cream and more.

Bob worked for many years as a long-distance truck driver and later in sales for a tractor supply and farming equipment company. He was diagnosed with a mobility-limiting condition in the muscular dystrophy-family called CMT (Charcot Marie Tooth) syndrome in his late 40s and ultimately retired at age 61.

Joan, 78, worked as an administrative assistant for Gerber Foods, a position which provided generous time off that

allowed her take a month vacation in winter in the years before her retirement at age 69. In addition to her duties with the Michigan Snowbird Club she also tutors school children several days per week with a local organization.

The couple settled on an ample 33-foot travel trailer when they became longer-term Snowbirds in

2003 in the Gulf Shores, Ala., area. They sold their home several years ago and now are "full-timers" living six months per year on the Gulf Coast and the rest of the time at a Fremont RV park where they now have a second travel trailer.

Bob learned construction skills from his dad who was a master builder and that came in handy when it came time to modify their travel trailer for his mobility issues and to better accommodate full-time living. He crafted wider, deeper and sturdier stairs to get in and out of the trailer and constructed better storage options in the bedroom and kitchen.

Both Joan and Bob said the camaraderie of the RV life is why they chose it. RVers typically use their outside spaces more and gather as neighbors to dine, visit and enjoy a campfire.

The Michigan Club has given them a chance to meet many new friends and the organization helps to give back to the community they love through fundraisers with other clubs and collaboration with area churches and organizations. Thanksgiving typically is celebrated in Gulf Shores with friends and they go to Atlanta to have Christmas with their grandchildren. Their family also visit the area during their stay enjoying all the Gulf Coast area has to offer.

Summers they reconnect with friends at the Michigan RV park and spend visiting their children all the while preparing for their winter return to the Gulf Coast.

Tucked between two towering condominium complexes is a beloved symbol of the beach of yesteryear.


Known as America's "Last Great Roadhouse" - the Flora-Bama aptly reflects its location straddling the Florida and Alabama borders.





There are nearly forty restaurants, bars, delis and cafes in downtown Mobile, and we've also compiled a suggested list of activities you can do in two, four and six hours in Mobile:





MARITIME: About 230 steps from the Alabama Cruise Terminal (yes, we counted!) is the one-ofa-kind GulfQuest National Maritime Museum. GulfQuest is the first and only museum dedicated to the Gulf Coast's rich maritime traditions from its discovery in the 1500s to the present day and one of the only interactive maritime museums in the country. So before you head out into the Gulf, learn all about the Gulf. It'll make your cruise that much more interesting, believe us!

PORT & FORT: The downtown waterfront of Mobile, Alabama is full of rich history, culture and economic importance to the region. This bustling port welcomes ships from all over the world along with tug boats and barges that roam the many rivers of North America. See them all up close from a USCG Certified passenger vessel with Wild Native Tours. The city skyline, maritime museum, Austal shipyards, cruise terminal and cruise ship are also seen on this tour. Courteous and knowledgeable guides will educate and entertain as you cruise these local waters. After your port tour, be sure to visit the Fort of Colonial Mobile, an immersive, interactive exhibit about the people who colonized early Mobile.



HISTORY LOVERS: Take an historic city tour, starting at the Visit Mobile Welcome Center, by car, van, trolley or duck boat. These usually last an hour to an hour and a half, which leaves plenty of time to explore historic downtown Mobile on foot, including the History Museum of Mobile and the Mobile Carnival Museum or hop across the Mobile River to board an authentic World War II battleship, the USS ALABAMA.

SHOPAHOLICS: Several new locally owned clothing boutiques, gift shops, vintage and antique stores and art galleries (some will ship your purchases home!) are located within blocks of each other downtown. We know you'll be grabbing some souvenirs in the Caribbean, but hey, taking a little bit of Mobile home with you is pretty awesome, too.

FAMILY FUN: The Gulf Coast Exploreum offers rotating exhibits and permanent activities designed to bring the scientist out in all of us. You'll notice an Oyster statue out in front of the Exploreum, which is a great starting point to walk The Oyster Trail throughout downtown Mobile (how many can you visit?). Mobile's newest addition to outdoor family fun is ArtGo, a self-guided free walking trail and outdoor art gallery that leads visitors to 33 public art pieces/installations. Pick up your map at the Mobile Arts Council at 318 Dauphin Street.



OUTDOORS: With a little more time on your hands, you can explore a little more of what the entire area has to offer. The crown jewel of Mobile, Bellingrath Gardens and Home is about 45 minutes west of the Alabama Cruise Terminal - plan to wander amongst the blooms for a few hours. Or, head east, just a few minutes of downtown and take an airboat ride, sightseeing cruise or guided kayak/canoe tours of the Mobile/Tensaw Delta (the views are a little different from the deck of the cruise ship but fascinating just the same!)

HISTORY AND CULTURE LOVERS: There are several historic homes in or near downtown, each offering guided tours. Pick up a Historic Homes brochure and plan to visit all five during your time here in Mobile. Hit the Mobile Museum Trail, visiting some of the previously mentioned downtown museums but also plan to stop by the largest art museum on the Gulf Coast, the Mobile Museum of Art, the Mobile Medical Museum, and the Archaeology Museum at the University of South Alabama.


## Preparing the Bellingrath Home for Christmas

- Garlands with and without lights are carefully attached to the railings of two staircases and elaborate ribbons and ornaments are added.
- Six lighted Christmas trees are set up in various parts of the house and each is
  - decorated with colors and ornaments to complement their location.
- Assorted wrapped gifts are placed beneath the tree in the Living Room along with a mechanical toy horse which was a Christmas present to Walter Bellingrath's nephew in 1952.
- A dozen wreaths are prepared to hang on exterior and some interior doors.
- In the Kitchen and Butler's Pantry garlands are hung above doorways and display cabinets and decorated with ornaments themed for Coca-Cola.
- Center table in the kitchen is transformed to hold lighted ceramic Coca-Cola Christmas village.
- Lighted garlands are placed on the Dining and Living porches.
- Fresh Bellingrath poinsettias in red, cream and pink are placed on the hearths
  of 9 fireplaces, the steps in the Living Room, the Kitchen and Butler's Pantry and

# Snowball Derby: Winter's hottest racing event

Who would have thought a 100-lap race on a chillingly cold December day in 1968 would still be going on today?

On Sunday, Dec. 3, the Snowball Derby will race for the 50th time at the famed half-mile track at Five Flags Speedway in Pensacola. Pensacola's Wayne Niedecken Sr. won that first race in front of maybe a thousand fans. Now, more than 10,000 fans pack the grandstands to watch more than 30 drivers race 300 laps on their way to the Tom Dawson Memorial Trophy, a big paycheck and the fame that comes with winning one of the top short-track races in the nation. Drivers from California to Canada show up each year for racing action that starts on the Wednesday before the first Sunday in December.

Others who managed to take the checkered flag include former NASCAR champion Darrel Waltrip and current NASCAR stars Chase Elliott and Kyle Busch. In fact, Busch returns this year to attempt to win his second title.



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
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## Sean of the South: What should you do with your life?
