

A Snowbird Journey: From Airstream to Historic DeFuniak Springs

Donna and Edward Sommer of Columbus, Ohio, discovered Florida's Emerald Coast in 2006.

Ed, now 76, was just 50 years old when he decided to retire from his benefits and retirement company. Donna, now 68, managed the couple's investment properties (they both do that today.)

Their children, daughter Jaime, 32 and sons Adam, 37, Tobias, 49, and Edward, 51, all work together in the company. The couple has seven grandchildren who live in the Columbus area.

Although they intended to build a home closer to the coast, a drive north of Interstate 10 to the quaint town of DeFuniak Springs changed that destiny. The couple fell in love with a historic home with a sprawling front porch and view of Circle Lake. They now spend six to eight months in the quaint town known as the home of the Florida Chautauqua.

The Sommers' Snowbird Story

We began staying at the Hilton Sandestin in 2006. We stayed for two to 2 ½ months. We discovered the Hilton when Ed decided to try camping and purchased a vintage Airstream camper. We camped at Camping on the Gulf in Miramar Beach. One day we took a break from the camper and went to the Hilton for a few nights. We discovered their wonderful Snowbird program and decided to become Hilton Snowbirds. We sold the Airstream and went to the Hilton for the next ten years.

As usual for us, we spent a great deal of time looking at properties in the area and eventually found a beautiful beach lot in Gulf Pines in Miramar Beach. We purchased the lot in 2012, intending to build a winter home. After much thought and many house plans, we decided that building a home at this point was not for us, and we sold the lot in 2018.

While we were at the Hilton, we spent time in DeFuniak Springs looking at the lovely old historic homes, enjoying the Christmas Reflections light show, and attending some of the Chataguaqua events there. During one of our visits to DeFuniak, we saw a beautiful 1907 Queen Anne home for sale and decided to look at it just for fun. Love at first sight. We looked at it about three or four times before we went back to Ohio in March of 2016. In June of 2016, we purchased our home in DeFuniak Springs. We spend 6-8 months a year here.



We enjoy living in this wonderful community. We have made many friends and enjoy the famous Southern hospitality. When we are in Florida, we like to take short trips. We go east to Panama City Beach, down to Apalachicola, down to St. George Island and on day trips to Fairhope, Ocean Springs, Biloxi and New Orleans.

During our visits, we try to go on home tours, neighborhood celebrations and visit any events that look like fun. We are always on the lookout for antique stores. We've found lovely things for our home during these little trips.

We, of course, love the restaurants on the beach and probably know all the Snowbird specials in Walton and Okaloosa counties. Some of our favorites are 790, Ocean Club, Marina Cafe, Cafe 30A and the Vue, which are all known for their Snowbird specials.

In 2018 we were lucky to find a lovely condo in Splash on Panama City Beach. Some of our children and

grandchildren have been able to come down and visit us in DeFuniak and at the condo in Panama City Beach

Life is good being a Snowbird, and we have been blessed.

Summer Home

We purchased our home in Ohio on Lake Erie in 1989. We are direct waterfront, so there is the opportunity for swimming, fishing and boating and watching all the boats on the Lake.

We are usually at home there from June to October, to enjoy the beautiful weather before the winter cold and snow come. It was a wonderful place for our children to spend their summers growing up and know they have wonderful memories of their summers there.



2020 Chautauqua aims to open a "world of happiness"

"Ryan's address will help all attendees find an inner peace and stillness through his insightful presentation, no matter how financially rich or poor we may be, how young or old, or what challenges we face," said

Holiday will explore "a new outlook on life where guests are empowered to understand what is in their control when facing life challenges \dots and what is not."

Holiday, author of "Stillness is the Key," will deliver the keynote presentation at the fourday educational event set for Jan. 23-26 at the historic Florida Chautauqua Assembly in DeFuniak Springs. The theme for 2020 is "A Journey into the World of Happiness," where organizers hope participants will learn to find inner peace and happiness through life-changing techniques to improve mind, body and soul. In addition to famous keynote speakers, the event includes educational breakout sessions, performance teas, evening dinner performances and exhibits centered around the theme.

Pamela Landwirth, president and chief executive officer of Give Kids The World Village in Kissimmee, Fla., will address audiences on the value of selfless giving at places like hers. Give Kids The World is a resort for sick children who are granted a wish by organizations like Make-A-Wish to meet Mickey Mouse and/or visit the Disney theme parks. Landwirth was Disney's human resources manager for 16 years.



"Her presentation will help all of us appreciate the power of giving selflessly to others who have less than we do," Mitchell said. "Following her presentation, I hope attendees will be inspired to bring a needed gift for the Village or to commit to volunteering at the Village at least for one day. It takes 1,800 volunteers a week to run the village for these very special children. However, Pamela's message is for us to understand the power of connecting with any cause that helps others selflessly."

Topics of breakout sessions include the value of journaling, letting go of ego, dealing with obstacles, mindfulness, natural healing techniques and the value of lavender. Participants may register for a tea with "Winston Churchill," interpreted by local actor Bruce Collier, who will share with guests how he found happiness and stillness while facing some of the world's greatest challenges. Annette Wise, leader of the Rosalynn Carter Butterfly Trail program in Plains, Ga., will teach classes on container gardening to attract butterflies.

Tickets to individual events start at \$9. Money-saving books of tickets called "passports," which include a choice of all presentations, sessions, teas and dinners, are available be purchased for \$150. The first 50 people to purchase a passport will also receive a hard-back copy of Holiday's book "Stillness is the Key," which he will autograph after his presentation.

The original annual multi-week Florida Chautauqua Assembly started in 1885 and lasted until 1927 on the grounds around Lake DeFuniak in DeFuniak Springs, according to Mitchell. In 1993, DeFuniak Springs residents founded an organization to revive the Assembly. In 1996, the organization hosted the first fully-revived assembly, which continues to this day. The current effort is led by an eight-member board of volunteers

based in DeFuniak Springs. Formerly featured personalities at the Florida Chautauqua include former White House

include former White House Deputy Chief of Staff Karl Rove, daughter of former South African Archbishop Desmond Tutu and human rights activist Naomi Tutu; "Leave it to Beaver" star Jerry Mathers and former First Lady Rosalynn Carter.







Master underwater aerobics, learn to fly a drone and more with continuing education

Whether you want to wade into the latest issues in cybersecurity, learn to play the dulcimer or dive into an aquatic aerobics class, the colleges along the Gulf Coast offer a wide variety of continuing education classes.

Snowbirds flock to winter courses at Pensacola State College, Northwest Florida State College and Gulf Coast State College, as well as other institutions, every winter to broaden their knowledge, engage socially and connect with their adopted communities. Here are the highlights of what is going to be offered in winter 2020:

Pensacola State College

Most of PSC's "leisure" courses in the new term will begin around the end of January, Some classes, including aquatics, fitness center and gymnastics, are ongoing throughout the year.



Tennis instructor Renee' Broxson thinks she knows why her Snowbird tennis students keep coming back for her courses: She cuts them no slack.

"I don't take it easy on them," said Broxson, the tennis director at Hidden Dunes Beach & Tennis Resort in Destin. "I believe that they can achieve whatever they want at any age if they work hard. We all have some limitations, but we work smarter, not always harder." Broxson has license to push her students because she, too, has expanded her horizons in some unconventional ways.

While she grew up in St. Louis, she visited Northwest Florida on visits to see family at Navarre Beach. She moved to the area when she was 20 years old. In 1992, at the age of 32, she won a scholarship playing tennis for the University of West Florida.

"I started tennis late in life. I practiced probably five hours a day while waitressing at the Holiday Inn on Navarre Beach," she said. "I was fortunate to have the right people in my life that coached me to get to a level that when (the UWF tennis coach) needed a player, I was sort of ready to go. Coach took the chance on me and gave me the best years of my life."

In 1997, Broxson graduated with a degree in physical education. She went on to serve as the assistant tennis coach at UWF for six years. She was also the tennis director at the Pensacola Country Club. She briefly



worked at the Watercolor community in South Walton County and has been at Hidden Dunes since 2005. Snowbirds are a vital part of the Hidden Dunes community this time of year, she said.

"I teach on a daily basis at Hidden Dunes," she said. "My boss when I started at Hidden Dunes really started the Snowbird program. When she left eight years ago, we were very focused on making our winter guests happy. We appreciate them because this is a very busy time for us. We welcome them like they are part of our family because they really are a big family. We even put in three new pickleball courts for them this year."

Pickleball combines elements of tennis, badminton and

ping-pong. It is played with paddles on a badminton-sized court.

"At the resort, we get a lot of customers that are only with us for a week. We do see improvement in their game in a week's time, but when we have the Snowbirds there for a couple of months, we can see great improvements," Broxson said. "If you want to get inspired, come to Hidden Dunes in the wintertime and see the older generation out walking, playing tennis, playing pickleball, going to the gym, etc. They are so inspiring."

If you think of Broxson's tennis career as a second act, then art would be her third. It's something she picked up a few years back – when the weather wasn't fit for tennis. "I started doing artwork about five years ago when we had about ten days of rain in a row," she said. "My mom was an artist and I traveled with her to art shows. That developed my love of art."

Broxson calls herself a "mixed media" artist.

"I build layers and layers to have plenty of history to dig back into," she said. "I use collage and acrylic paint, graphite pencil and sometimes just found items." Her art is on display at Hidden Dunes and Beachworx in Destin. A portion of the proceeds from her art sales goes to Dog-Harmony, a dog rescue group in Santa Rosa Beach on which she serves as a board member.

"I am motivated to create art because I am ready to accomplish another goal," she said. "Just like with tennis, putting the hours in is what it takes to become a good artist."

In fact, Broxson thinks elbow grease and determination are as important as what some people might call natural talent.

"I do not believe in talent. Or, should I say, I believe that talent is skill that is learned," she said. "Hard work, risk, determination, positive attitude, and trusting God to provide will help you reach the end result you strive for in your practice. In art and tennis, there is always room to improve and to keep learning new things."





Giving Chronic Pain Sufferers





Patients find relief with fewer pills with breakthrough new clinic in Gulf Shores.

Those battling with pain, but unable or unwilling to alleviate their condition with potentially addictive pills, can feel as if they are on pins and needles waiting for a solution.

However, for some suffering from pain, pins and needles ARE the solution.

Dr. Kate Weighart, DAOM, L.Ac., who trained in Manhattan and practices Acupuncture and other advanced procedures at Alabama Acupuncture and Wellness, said a lot of the pain management field is skittish about prescribing pain medication.

"I've been maxed out of nerve pain meds, and all the doctors said to just live with it," said Richard Pratt of Georgia. "It (Acupuncture) was the last resort, with the best results." Pratt began to see Dr. Weighart in November for lingering effects from a 30 foot fall he took from a tree in 1998.

"I think she does a heck of a job, Pratt said. "I'd fallen and put my hip through the pelvic socket." Additionally, Pratt had injured his ribs, vertebrae, and tailbone. "I hate pills. If

possible, I'd rather not take them." Pratt said.
