





On the Road Again

Retirement has been a wonderful road of discovery in many ways for Sharie and Dick Gibbs of Newcomb, N.Y.

The couple spends more than half the year on the road in their fifth wheel. They embark from their family home in the Adirondack Mountains usually in August or September and set out for Florida for the winter.

But Sharie and Dick recently made a big decision by purchasing a 45 x 14 park model home at Grand Lakes Golf and RV Resort for their winter stay in Ocala. The home features one bedroom, kitchen, full bath, washer and dryer and even a dishwasher.

It doesn't mean that they will give up RVing, however. "Our plans are to either sell the fifth wheel or park it on our land at home by the lake," Sharie said. "But we'll probably use our truck camper or even buy a smaller fifth wheel when we set out west next August. We like having options."

Sharie, 63, a retired government secretary and Dick, 64, a retired heavy equipment operator, have discovered the value of new friendships in retirement.

"The man I've known for 47 years all of sudden is a social butterfly," Sharie said. "He really likes meeting all the people. I'm seeing a new side of my husband -- a good side."

The Gibbs' enjoy the many activities sponsored on-site at their RV park and they take advantage of Ocala's central location to nearby Gainesville, home of the University of Florida for extra entertainment.

Like many RVers – who savor the lifestyle – the Gibbs spend ample time seeing the sights as they travel to their winter destination.

A stopover at Harper's Ferry, West Va., and the Smithsonian Institute's Aviation Museum led the Gibbs to an unplanned destination in late fall -- the newly reopened campground at Ft. Pickens and the Gulf Islands National Seashore east of Pensacola Beach.

The campgrounds and Ft. Pickens had been closed for five years after being heavily damaged by Hurricane Ivan in 2004 and a second blow by Hurricane Dennis in 2005.

The couple made stopovers in Tennessee and Alabama before making the unplanned stop in Pensacola.

"We met some people and were telling them about the Smithsonian Aviation and they told us if we wanted to see a beautiful air museum go to Pensacola where the Blue

Angels are out of," said Sharie. "We ended up spending a full week at Ft. Pickens and we only intended to stay a few days. We found so many beautiful things to do we kept staying a couple more days."

The couple were duly impressed by the National Naval Aviation Museum but also found themselves enjoying other amenities, including walking the white-sand beaches, dining at the oyster bar at Peg Leg Pete's on Pensacola Beach and driving the length of the national seashore to the eastern end at Navarre Beach.

Although they love the beach, it's the rolling hills and serenity of the many horse farms found in the Ocala area that convinced them to make the area their winter home.

The journey back to New York in the spring will likely include stops along the way to visit new friends and visits to recommended attractions.

The Gibbs aren't on a timetable. They are enjoying retirement as it's meant to be.

Snowbird Volunteers

Volunteering does more than help others, it helps those who do the helping, too.

Studies show that volunteering helps you live longer and promotes a positive outlook on life. And, a life's worth of knowledge and experience makes senior and snowbird volunteers critical to the success of many organizations.

Many South Florida senior volunteers find the perfect opportunity through local branches of RSVP, the Retired & Senior Volunteer Program, a national program funded through the Corporation for National and Community Service.

In St. Petersburg, the Pinellas County RSVP volunteers serve a wide range of organizations. Program specialist Sandra Devaughn said seniors and Snowbird volunteers are a dedicated group that has enormous impact on local organizations.

"We have a lot of people who come back year after year," Devaughn said. "They are here for six months, and some of them like to stay with what they have been doing for years, and some of them like to try something new."

Pinellas RSVP places volunteers with schools, libraries, hospitals, museums, social services, and community and public safety. Some organizations have simple applications while others have more extensive screening processes for potential volunteers, she said. Health and public safety organizations are most likely to require screenings and training.

"These organizations are dependent on their senior volunteers," Devaughn said.

"They really are dedicated to what they are doing and they have the experience. They are willing to share and give back to the community, whether it is with a senior one-on-one or a child.

"They see the need is there and they go and try to resolve by using their skills and talents," she said. "They volunteer at home and they volunteer here. They are really dedicated in what they do."

Established in 1971 and now one of the largest senior volunteer organizations in the nation, nationally RSVP engages over 400,000 people age 55 and better in a diverse range of volunteer activities. RSVP volunteers choose how, where, and how often they want to serve, with commitments ranging from a few hours to 40 hours per week.

In the Ocala area, RSVP volunteers serve in nonprofit organizations within Marion County. Many volunteers use their experience to tutor and mentor children or adults, serve in hospitals, assist in the delivery of meals, act as museum docents, work with community patrols, help with administrative responsibilities, and use professional experiences in the role of career coach.

In Ocala, RSVP has collaborated with the Senior Institute of Central Florida Community College in offering free admission to classes from the lifelong learning catalog. RSVP volunteers will receive one fee waiver per semester for an opportunity to take college level classes, on a space available basis, without the worry of tests or grades.

Sarasota's own program, Volunteer Sarasota, offers programs for regular volunteers and annual event volunteers. Regular volunteers can choose to join specific groups and dedicate their volunteer efforts to a special area, event or activity. These volunteers are a critical part of running and maintaining area libraries, parks, beaches, community centers (including tennis clubs), and even Chuck Reiter Stadium.

Annual event volunteers can join others in dedicating their time to a special reoccurring event or activity such as beach clean ups, anniversary celebrations and more.

But Snowbirds looking for an outlet for their experience can also follow their passions and find their own volunteer opportunities.

The Sarasota Orchestra, for example, invites volunteers to "whistle while you work."

"We have a general volunteer list or things we need to have done, or they can tell us what to do," said administrative receptionist Sandra Jahnke, who helps organize volunteers. "They are not only doing good work for us, they are reaching out to the community."

Orchestra volunteers do everything from helping to organize and host events and parties to working at the Sarasota Music Festival to fundraising and helping the nationally recognized Youth Orchestra program.

Snowbird volunteers stay in touch with the organization year round so they can hit the ground running when they return for the winter months, Jahnke said.

"They are very active," she said. Several of the programs are run entirely by volunteers. "They are very autonomous, and it's great!"

"The people who are in our associations have experience, they know how to organize and get things done," Jahnke said. "And besides that, they have fun!"

No matter what your skill or interest, there is a volunteer opportunity that can optimize your skills for the greater good of individuals, organizations and the community. RSVP programs have an ongoing need for volunteers in the following areas:

Finding the local greats

One of the best ways to find a great place to eat is to ask the locals.

That's the way we found the newly renamed "Mugs Grill and Bar" in Clearwater. The restaurant is also known as Mugs on Missouri as a reference to its street location.

Formerly called Mugs and Jugs, the restaurant is in the process of rebranding from a sports bar to a great place to watch sports in a family atmosphere.

"We have great food and great service – we don't need short shorts," said owner Abraham Moussa. "So we changed the uniform and changed the name. And we are putting more customers in our seats."

What Moussa hasn't changed is the quality of his food – particularly the restaurant's signature oversized wings.

"Most restaurants buy eight to 10 (wings) per count," Moussa said. "We buy five to seven per count."

Mugs' wings are "crispy, crunchy, big and tasty," Moussa said. His sauce recipes are top secret and have been kitchen tested since he opened his first store 12 years ago. Another key to the great reputation his wings enjoy is that the vegetable oil is kept fresh and changed daily.

If you aren't in the mood for wings, Moussa suggests you try the oversized hamburger fashioned from fresh premium ground chuck or the barbeque ribs which literally "fall off the bone." Salads are made fresh to order for those looking for lighter fare. If you've saved room sample one of the signature half dozen desserts including



Think adult education is all about sitting in a chair, listening to dry, boring lectures?

Of course not. Leave that for the kids. Adults have options.

Each year an estimated 35,000 Snowbirds attend the two-day event Jan. 26-27 at the Lakeland Center in Lakeland, Fla.

About 60 percent of the attendees are Canadian and the rest are American and European Snowbirds.

Sponsored by Medipac and the CSA, Snowbirds are drawn to the variety of vendors who display their services and wares, entertainment and helpful information to help them enjoy their stay.

An event highlight is autograph sessions with Dave Hunter, author of "Along Interstate 75" (www.i75online.com). Headliner entertainment includes Grammy award winner Walter Ostanek; former Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus performer, Sean Emery; Tom Leadbetter, a tenor from Nova Scotia; The Harmonicats and jazz legend Peter Appleyard.

200,000," said CSA spokesperson Michael McKenzie. "About 74 percent travel to Florida."

Florida's recent correction in real estate prices have made the state once again attractive to Canadians. McKenzie also said his countrymen weren't affected as harshly in the recent economic meltdown as Americans and they have more discretionary money to spend.

The Extravaganza was started nearly a decade ago and the CSA was formed in 1992 specifically to assist traveling Snowbirds.

Many spend the whole winter – up to six months - the maximum allowed by the Canadian government for those who wish to still be covered under the country's health plan.

Along with health care, the CSA offers a popular currency exchange program that will automatically transfer money from a Canadian account into an American account. The organization also keeps members up to date on political topics by province and serves as an advocacy group for issues such as American property taxes, insurance and more.

When playing Airco Golf Course, Gabriel Cooke, a Snowbird from Toronto, is oblivious to the airplanes taking off at nearby St. Petersburg-Clearwater International Airport.

"What noise?" Cooke says, with a chuckle. "The only thing I hear are the birdies."

And Cooke is talking about the birdies he makes on the 18-hole golf course in Clearwater, one of the few championship public courses in Pinellas County, just west of Tampa.

Cooke and his wife like to get out on the course at 7 a.m., play a round, then spent the rest of the day doing other things.

"It's well-kept and it's well-run," he said of Airco. "The course is not too punitive and the price is right."

That's what Larry Thomas, Director of Golf Operations, is trying to do.

He joined the golf club 10 years ago, about the same time that the county took it over.

The golf course receives no tax revenue from the county so all profits are turned back into improving the course.

"We're trying to do some creative things," Thomas said. "It's all about a good golf experience. We want people to say we're affordable and we're really nice people."

The course opened in 1961 and was designed by Chick Adams. The course record is 61, set by PGA Tour player Greg Craft.

Thomas says the highest fee the course charges is \$46 with a cart. In the off-season, prices run around \$25.

An annual pass is about 25 percent off for greens fees. A Canadian league plays each

The course includes chipping and putting greens, pro shop, a warm-up station with net that was built after the driving range was lost when the airport runway was extended.

"The thing to do is surround yourself with good people," he said. "My staff are people persons."

They are working on an Audubon certification.

A private restaurant, Stonybrook Pub, is located on the second floor upstairs.

Thomas said they usually play about 40,000 rounds of golf at the course. The signature hole is the par-3 17th.

"The fairways are open and the rough is forgiving," Thomas said. "Plus, you get to see the planes take off."

Are you or is someone you know a binge-drinker?

One of the largest surveys of substance use has found a remarkable amount of binge-drinking among older Americans.

The findings, published in The American Journal of Psychiatry, were reported by researchers at Duke University Medical Center.

The National Survey on Drug Use and Health found that 22 percent of men and 9 percent of women aged 50 to 64 reported binge drinking -- five or more drinks at a time -- within the last month. In this age group, "at-risk" drinking -- two or more drinks per day -- was found among 19 percent of men and 13 percent of women.

The group aged 65 and up reported binge drinking in 14 percent of men and 3 percent of women. "At-risk" drinking was found among 13 percent of men and eight percent of women in this age group.

"A surprising number of older Americans are engaging in drinking patterns that are putting their health at risk, yet these problems often go unrecognized," said Dan G. Blazer MD, PhD, the study's lead author and JP Gibbons Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Duke. "With this study we've learned that adults, especially those in their fifties, are carrying a heavier drinking burden into late life."

Blazer explained that this trend illustrates a potentially greater problem in the future as the baby boomer generation ages. He said that if their current drinking habits continue into their senior years, they could be compounding health problems that typically arise as the body's natural defenses are weakened. The negative health effects of binge drinking can range from minor injuries to more serious problems, such as stroke, cardiovascular disease, liver disease, neurological damage and poor diabetes control.

The authors propose a more rigorous use of screening for substance use and brief intervention or counseling to address the rise in alcohol use.

"Middle age and older adults may be easy to miss for at-risk or binge drinking because most clinicians are focused on excessive drinking behaviors among young people, such as those in college," Blazer said. "They also don't show the typical signs of alcohol dependence."

A nationally representative survey of nearly 11,000 men and women over 50 asked about their use of alcohol over the last year and the usual number of drinks they consumed on a drinking day during the past 30 days. The survey was conducted in 2005 and 2006. Binge drinking and at-risk drinking were defined by American Geriatrics Society Guidelines.
