



Lifelong educator Bob Slack knew he wanted to keep busy in retirement.

The Slacks chose Winter Haven as their ultimate retirement destination and Four Lakes Golf Club where they have found a home.

"We looked at a lot of places but there was just something about Four Lakes," Bob said. "We can't keep up with everything they offer here. There is everything from bingo to cards, line dancing and other kind of dances. We like to golf four or five times a week."

Staying healthy is not only a mission for the Slacks but a lifestyle and a reason they decided to move south for the winter.

"We are prolonging our lives is the way we look at it," Bob said. "Back home we are bound up for the winter. Here we are out and about and have a whole social network."

Easy Breezy Florida Dining

Perhaps it should be no surprise that Joy and Jack Harris collaborated on a cookbook called "Easy Breezy Florida Cooking."

The couple's first meeting came on the set of a television show that Jack was hosting, with Joy as a guest expert on Florida seafood. They met briefly before the show's cooking segment.

Now married for 24 years, the couple has been a team ever since.

Jack, a veteran broadcaster of television and radio, is widely known throughout the Tampa Bay area. Joy, whose background and education is in home economics, began experimenting in the kitchen when she was a young girl.

Joy mostly makes the dishes in their home and Jack is her chief taster. His observations are sprinkled throughout the 101-page cookbook published by Seaside Publishing.

Joy introduces the cookbook this way: "Call it a love affair with food: My cooking, Jack eating – each of us doing what we love."

Throughout its pages, "Easy Breezy Florida Cooking" features recipes using fresh Florida ingredients, such as Ruskin tomatoes, Zellwood corn, Plant City strawberries, Florida seafood and fresh Cuban bread.

Joy traces her passion for cooking to family reunions she attended as a girl.

She describes the foods served at those gatherings in the book: "...farm-fresh eggs and vegetables from the garden were served alongside all my aunts' scrumptious cakes and pies.

"This was the education of my senses – the basis of my appreciation for fresh, wholesome, delectable food," Joy writes.

During a recent interview, she recalled bartering with her mother, who was an excellent seamstress: Joy would cook the meals; her mother would sew Joy's clothes.

Half of recipes contained in "Easy Breezy Florida Cooking" were created just for the book, Joy said.

She spent about a year working on the book, and Jack, dutifully tasted each recipe. A chore, by the way, he said he thoroughly enjoyed.

This isn't the first time that the couple has shared the pages of a book. Joy contributed 35 pages of recipes to "Jack Harris unwrapped!" a book by Jack that was published Seaside Publishing.

Cooking is Joy's sanctuary.

"I love to cook," she said. "When I'm under stress, I cook. When a hurricane is coming, I cook."

Indeed, when Hurricane Charley was barreling toward Tampa Bay, Joy was in her kitchen making a soufflé.

It was a recipe she had tried and failed when she was young. She was determined to master it, and she did.

"I knew I could do it," she said, triumphantly.


In creating the recipes, Joy sought to include ingredients that were readily available. "I didn't think about price or calories," she said.

Joy said she has a knack for figuring out combinations of ingredients that work well in a recipe. When she tastes a dish, for instance, she can usually tell what's in it and has a good sense for what ingredient could be added, reduced or eliminated to improve the flavor.

"There is chemistry to it," she said, adding that once you've figure out the basics, it is easier to determine which combinations will taste good.sJoy said she had fun creating the recipes and giving them names.

Her "Flamingo Pink Lime Pie," is her variation on a key lime pie. "It's just pink," she said. "It's easy to make."

Joy did let Jack name one of the recipes.



He came up with "Ruskini Aurora," to describe a dish that combines a sauce featuring Ruskin tomatoes and rotini, an Italian pasta.

Its salads include Frosty Florida Fruit Salad, Hot Lime Slaw, Orange Grove Romaine Salad and Taste of Florida Tomato-Lime Salad.

Like the other recipes, many entrees feature local ingredients. They include Sunshine State Shrimp Kebobs, Floridian Oven-Fried Grouper, Snapper Au Gratin, Chicken and Yellow Rice, Kumquat Chicken Kebobs, Citrus Rubbed Steak, Orange Cream with Tenderloin and Sweet Orange Rubbed Pork.

There's a section on soups, stews and sandwiches which includes a Quacamole Chicken Salad Sandwich, a Y'All Come Avocado Provolone Sandwich and a Cuban Reuban, to name just a few.

Soups include Taste of Tampa Ham and Bean Soup, Zellwood Corn Chowder and Southern Florida Lime Chili. There's also Jackson's Black Bean Chili, named in honor of the couple's son.

There are plenty of recipes for side dishes and desserts, too.

Each year tens of thousands of people browse, shop and research the latest innovations in recreational vehicles at a variety of Florida shows.

But the largest is the 2011 Florida RV Supershow set for Jan. 12-16 at the Tampa Fairgrounds which

draws upward to 50,000 people over the four-day event.

There dealers and manufacturers show off the more than 1200 brand new RVs. Products, accessories, RV parks and destinations are featured in the more than 300 booths at mammoth event. Manufacturer representatives also offer seminars throughout the show.

"The basic idea is to show every product side by side," said Dave Kelly, marketing director for the Florida RV Trade Assocation. "You get a comparison of every size and shape RV available on the market."

Kelly said Snowbirds and other winter visitors constitute about 50 percent of the show's attendees and they often arrive educated about the products they will see.

"Many have done their homework and are ready to pull the trigger (on buying)," Kelly said. "It's very competitive and dealers are in a sales mode."

Sales trends in the last couple of recession years show that smaller and lighter weight models are the most popular and nine of 10 are travel trailers. Many often upgrade to larger models depending on their needs.

Kelly said Snowbirds often buy in Florida where they use the RV for the winter and then put it in "mothballs" until the first snowflake falls the next year.

Among the many accessories popular in recent years are upgraded flat screen high definition televisions, satellite TV, surround sound, Blu-ray players. RVers also have embraced more outdoor-style stove tops and sinks and outside televisions so they can cook and be outside to enjoy their neighbor's and the great weather.

And along with updated features, many of today's RVers are migrating to amenity-filled parks that feature heated swimming pools, walking trails and golf courses. Florida also offers a wide variety of state and national parks with stunning natural landscapes.

Kelly has worked in the business for 14 years and has seen first-hand the attractiveness of the RV lifestyle.

"RVers are the nicest group of people you will ever want to meet," Kelly said. "Can you imagine going to a hotel and your next door neighbor comes over and introduces himself and invites you over for stew later?"

"It's a big part of why people embrace RVing."



The course is only 10 minutes from the Island View Casino Resort in Gulfport and 25 minutes from a half dozen casinos in Biloxi. It's also just an hour away from New Orleans and Mobile, Ala., for other side trip options.

The Oaks offers competitive rates, including a "best rate guarantee" on its website, www.theoaksgolfclub.com.

Rounds may also be booked through casino packages.

"We pride ourselves on the overall experience," Bloom said. "Our level of service is higher than most. We provide Southern hospitality. We remember their names. It's not a stifling place. We do our best to make sure they have a great day."

The course received 41/2 stars from Golf Digest magazine and is ranked in the top 10 in the state, including sixth in 2009.

"We don't have a lot of elevation in Mississippi, but here we have wetlands that run through the property, so we have elevated changes that makes gives the course a lot of character," Bloom said.

The live oaks come into play on about a half-dozen holes. Three of the par-3 holes are over water.

The signature hole of The Oaks is the par-5 sixth hole, which has a creek that runs in front of the green. Behind the green is the course's signature oak tree.

"The rolling terrain makes it fair for all level of golfers," Bloom said.

The back tees play from 7,000 yards; 6,300 yards from the blue tees; and 5,700 yards from the white tees. The greens, a hybrid Bermuda, are medium-sized, averaging around 5,000-6,000 square feet. A few of them are tiered greens, but not severe around the hole, Bloom says.

While the golf course receives top billing, an added attraction is the beverage cart attendants double as servers at the local Hooters restaurant.





Gulf Coast Lighthouses

By Jahna Jacobson

Lighthouses guide ships through stormy seas and help us navigate our shores.

And they often stand as a symbol of hope and guidance.

Along the Gulf Coast, lighthouses were a critical part of the development of not only the regional but the national economy.

These "points of light" have marked safe passage for mariners since the early 19th century and helped push forward state-of-the-art in technology, optics and coastal architecture.

This year, Pensacola PBS affiliate WSRE-TV produced an hour-long documentary about several of the Gulf Coasts most historic, impressive and endangered lighthouses, "Lighthouses of the Gulf Coast: Sand Island to St. Marks."

Producer and director Mark Bowen had the idea for a lighthouse documentary over 15 years ago. While working as a cameraman for a local television station more than 15 years ago, he was one of the first people to climb the Pensacola lighthouse when it was opened to the public in 1994.

"I was given the opportunity to do a two-minute video essay," he said. "It was such an interesting subject, I knew there was a lot more to be covered."

The lighthouses of the Gulf coast are some of the oldest in the country.

98 was established in the 1920s, the ship traffic from Pensacola to Panama City or Camp Walton was the only way to travel. Larger ships would move goods and commerce, prior to the Civil War this area was huge in terms of the United States commerce."

During that time, most of the federal government revenue came from tariffs, so protecting and providing tools for maritime trade was vital to the nation's overall health, Bowen said. In the wake of the war of 1812, protecting the nations beaches was also of vital importance. It was these factors that combined to aid in the construction of the Gulf Coast lighthouses.

But the real challenge is a familiar one: Trying to build tall, substantial structures in areas where storms are frequent and the sands are shifting.

The lighthouses on the Gulf Coast faced the additional challenge of the area's flat landscape. Lighthouses along the Atlantic Northeast have the advantage of high, rocky sites while the southern lighthouses needed to add extra high to overcome site challenges and the notoriously hazy weather along the southern shores. Vital inlets such as the bays at Mobile and Pensacola were difficult to spot from the gulf. Marking their entrances was critical for trade and military vessels.

For daytime sighting, each lighthouse is painted or arranged in a distinctive way, so you can see it during daylight hours and use if for navigation, Bowen said. At

Boca Grande Lighthouse

Gasparilla Island State Park, on a barrier island off Florida's Gulf shore, is home to Boca Grande Lighthouse. This unusual "lighthouse on stilts" has been completely restored by a local historical society and offers tours and events year-round. One more fascinating Florida Gulf Coast lighthouse to visit is on Egmont Key, accessible only by private charter boat. Having been struck by lightning, pounded by hurricanes and fought over by Union and Confederate forces, this quiet monument now stands as a reminder of Florida's early history.

Pensacola Light House

Built in 1859. Climb 177 steps for a spectacular view of the Pensacola, Fl. Area. Located on Pensacola's Naval Air Station. www.pensacolalighthouse.org

St. George Lighthouse

Built in 1852; destroyed in 2005; reconstructed and opened to the public in 2008. Located on Little St. George Island, Fl. www.stgeorgelight.org


