



Missouri couple enjoy Alabama community

Debbie, 65, and Mark Rethemeyer, 67, are used to being part of a community in their home state of Missouri. The couple met in college and married five years later. The duo are active volunteers for the Shriner's organization where he entertains as a clown. They created a food kitchen that served the needy for many years. They brought that cando attitude to the Alabama coast and are serving others. Debbie found out how special the Fort Morgan community is when she slipped on wooden stairs in pouring rain one year. She received emergency care from the Fort Morgan volunteer fire department/EMTs who continued to assist her when she required weekly medical appointments following surgery. They want to express their appreciation to the medical staff at South Baldwin Medical Center. Here is their story.

Q. How did you meet and how long have you been married?

We met in college in 1974. We were both studying Business and had just joined the Associated Junior Retailers Program. One of the professors threw a Halloween party for the students in the program and that's where we met. Little did we know at the party that we would meet again just two days later. That next Monday we both showed up at an orientation for the Executive Training program at Famous Barr (now Macy's). We went through college together and dated 5 years before getting married on June 29, 1979. We've been together 47 years and married 42 years!



Q. When did you start coming to the Alabama Gulf Coast? How did you find it?

We are very active in the Shriners, and we have several Shriner friends in St. Louis that snowbird in Gulf Shores every year. We would see the pictures and hear all the fun stories. When we retired in 2015 and started snowbirding with our friends in 2016. Some of our friends had been snowbirding for 20 years and were able to hook us up with rental properties in Fort Morgan where they were all staying. We had five houses in a row and several others staying nearby at the Beach Club. We would all get together for dinner and then have game-night at one of the houses. We play 5-Crowns (card game), Farkle (dice game), cards, and pretty much any other game you can think of.



Q. Do you have family and/or friends who visit? We always rent a house that can accommodate visitors. We do have several friends that come to visit during our stay. Some that are just passing through and stay for a few days, and some that make the trip and stay with us for a week or two. There have been times when we have had a couple different guests at the same time, but we are all good friends in St. Louis, so it works out well.

Q. Where do you stay on the Alabama coast? We rent in Fort Morgan with our friends. We love being oceanfront and off the beaten path in Fort Morgan where the serenity is intoxicating. We just walk down the stairs, and the ocean is right there, or we can walk next door and get together. Sometimes in the morning we'll all just go out on our decks and yell back and forth making plans for the day. It's cozy and comforting that we are all together. It's great to have friends living next door!

Q. What activities do you enjoy while you are here? How did you get involved in them?

We do a lot with the Missouri Snowbird Club. During January and February, they have a Weekly Breakfast on Wednesdays at 9 a.m. at Perdido Beach Resort, Happy Hour on Mondays at Cobalt's at 4 p.m., Golf Scramble on Wednesdays at 1 p.m. at the Gulf Shores Country Club

Q. What attracted you to the Alabama coast? What keeps you coming back?


Our friends that had been coming for many years and we kept hearing the stories, so when we retired, we decided to give it a try. Once we got here, we found the local people of Ft. Morgan, Gulf Shores, and Orange Beach take Southern Hospitality to the next level. We also have made so many new friends through the Missouri Snowbird Club. When you are changing jobs, or moving we always asked ourselves - "Are we running away from something? Or, running to something?" We started coming to the gulf to run away from the nasty weather that St. Louis offers all winter. But that has changed through the years. These days we are running to the gulf for fun and friendship. The great weather is just a perk, but it's the friends and fun that keep us coming back.

Q. If someone were to ask you for a referral for Snowbirding along the northern coast, what would you say?

We would highly recommend snowbirding in Gulf Shores. Just stay anywhere from Fort Morgan to Orange Beach and you are in the heart of the action. And most of all "Get Involved" volunteering and socializing. We have been members of the Missouri Snowbirds since we first started coming to Gulf Shores. They are a very friendly group and although mostly from Missouri, they have members from all around the country. 
Ceramic Arts in Maine.

The event attracts local artists and students eager to utilize the historic Anagama & Ralph H. Phillips Kilns and contribute to the festival.


Attendees are welcome to join the lines to view and help unload two large historical kilns. Art pieces will be available for sale at the discretion of the artists.



But, the Brat Fest and Low Country Boil were canceled in 2021 due to Covid and hurricane Sally. In 2022, their respective snowbird committees have met and determined they will not proceed this year due to some Covid concerns and lack of sufficient volunteers, as well as snowbirds to buy enough tickets. FUNDRAISERS

The 11 Alabama Gulf State Snowbird clubs have over the years worked together during their winter visits to raise funds for various community causes. The clubs have also independently made significant donations of their own. But the big projects that have attracted attention and appreciation from the snowbird and local communities are the Brat Fest, a benefit for the local fire departments, typically conducted on Super Bowl Weekend, and the Low Country Boil, a benefit for the Alabama Gulf Coast Zoo, and typically conducted the 3rd week in February. Many hundreds of hours of planning and execution have gone into these fundraising functions by the Snowbirds every year, until 2021. They were both canceled last year due to Covid cautions and the very low number of snowbirds at the beach due to Covid and the aftermath of Hurricane Sally. Until that year, the Brat Fest had donated nearly \$120,000 to the Gulf Shores, Orange Beach, and Fort Morgan Fire Departments, and the Low Country Boil had donated over \$86,000 to the Alabama Gulf Coast Zoo.

The Brat Fest and Low Country Boil Snowbird committees regretfully announce that these fund raising events will not be conducted in 2022 as they had planned. Like 2021, there are still some concerns regarding Covid health issues. In addition, all the snowbird state clubs have numbers of state members visiting this year less than 50% of that experienced in 2020 and preceding years. And, many of the previous volunteers and experienced snowbird leaders serving critical volunteer functions are not here this year.

Both committees are considering their options for 2023, given some degree of optimism that we would get back to a degree of normalcy on the Alabama Gulf Coast by then. They also express their thanks and appreciation to their members and to the local fire department and zoo leaders who helped implement these ambitious fund raisers over the years, and beg for their patience and understanding until the snowbirds can figure out how to get back to their "good old days"!







