


## By foot, wheel or hoof: 25 years of trail activity in Milton

By Louis Cooper For 25 years, people who enjoy everything from a leisurely stroll to a quick-paced bike ride - or even a mounted equestrian trot - have benefited from the Blackwater Heritage State Trail in Milton, Florida.

To celebrate the quarter century point in the trail's service, more than 130 people braved the drizzle and chill for a 2.5-mile Fun Run on Feb. 17.

"Every day there are people out there," said Walt Schumann, president of the trail's volunteer support organization. "It gives a walkway for people to get through town, by the high school and out to the country."



The trail attracts people of all sorts, from families with strollers to seniors on electric bikes, according to Schumann.

"People running, rollerblading and walking is what I mostly see on the trail," he said. "It varies on the time of day. If it's during work hours, I see more people who are more senior, people who are 50 and older."



The Blackwater Heritage State Trail is a paved, 10-foot-wide trail that is 8.1 miles long, starting in downtown Milton near the intersection of Stewart and Caroline streets. The Visitor Center, which includes restrooms and vending, is located at 5533 Alabama St., Milton, Florida, 32570. The trail is free to use.

"You can literally walk to restaurants on the sidewalks that take you to downtown Milton," Schumann said. "It really connects the whole community."

The trail travels through the commercial area of downtown Milton, passes City Hall, and out into the countryside beside gardens and

through woodlands to the eastern gate of Whiting Field Naval Air Station. The northern most sector of the trail is open to those mounted on horses, with a parking lot equipped for equine trailers located along the trail near Munson Highway north of Milton.

With efforts starting as early as 1989, the Blackwater Heritage Trail is part of the larger "Rails-to Trails" movement where abandoned railroad rights-of-ways were repurposed as "linear parks" for the public use.

The corridor that is now known as the Blackwater trail was once a train track bed that connected Whiting Field to Blackwater Bay. The trail was officially dedicated and opened in February 1999.

Over the life of the trail, it has seen two short extensions: one to the south, starting from the original trailhead at Stewart and Caroline streets, as well as an addition on the north, called the Military Heritage





Trail, near Whiting Field.

There are lots of opportunities to see the great Gulf Coast outdoors from well-maintained trailways, including:

## **Gulf State Park, Gulf Shores, Ala.**

This 6,150-acre park boasts the Hugh S. Branyon Backcountry Trail, which includes more than 28 miles of paved trails, built both for hikers and cyclists and are accessible in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). There are trailheads surrounding the perimeter of the park.Bike rentals are available.

Kenari Quartet, which has won prizes and released an album. An accomplished composer, he has received commissions from various organizations and premiered works at Carnegie Hall. 


