Breakfast with a Gulf view at Windjammers on the Pier

There are many opportunities for weekend "brunch," but those places are often crowded. Finding breakfast with a Gulf view is a rarity.

So, when Windjammers on the Pier on Navarre Beach announced earlier this year that it was adding breakfast, I rejoiced! The sound of the surf set against a backdrop of emerald green water sets the stage! A quick browse through the menu revealed



moderate prices for breakfast entrees starting at \$10.

On my first visit. I chose avocado toast. which was seasoned with sea salt, lime, cilantro, pico de gallo and cotijo cheese. The order was plentiful, tasty and filling (just \$10). I also sampled an egg Benedict (huge portion) served with ham, two poached eggs and hollandaise sauce served over a biscuit (\$12). Other options included a Classic Breakfast with two eggs, sausage or bacon, grits or potatoes and a choice of biscuit or toast (\$10), Crab Cake Benedict (\$20), Ranchero Breakfast Burrito (\$16) and several others. Other tempting options were the Vanilla Bean French, Toast topped with a warm berry compote, whipped cream and powdered sugar (\$14), a Monte Cristo with ham and cheese battered and fried, topped by powdered sugar (\$15) and Chicken and Waffles (\$19).

An expansive cocktail list includes Mimosa (\$5), classic Bloody Mary (\$10), Peach Bellini (\$8) and several more. A variety of Mocktails (no alcohol) are served so all can join the festivities! The lively bar attracts a sports-hungry crowd with multiple games



showing. Live entertainment is on tap at various times, too.

Follow the Facebook page and consult the website for updates. A full Thanksgiving dinner with dessert will be offered, and a New Year's Eve dinner and celebration will be staged with fireworks.

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Mississippi Snowbirds enjoy volunteering at Gulf Islands National Seashore

Q. What are your names and where are each of you from?

Our names are Andy Vreeland and Gail Vreeland. We are from the Mississippi Gulf Coast and we are both retired.



Q. Where do you currently live? Where did you move from and why did you move?

We lived in Long Beach, Mississippi, until Hurricane Katrina hit and we lost our home. We were transferred to Northeast Georgia with my work and lived there for 17 years until I retired. We then decided to relocate back to Carnes, Mississippi, so we could be closer to our family. We were both previously married. We both have two children each and are the proud grandparents of six grandchildren and two great grandchildren.



Q. How did you meet - and how long ago?

We met while working as operations managers for Kmart Corporation. Gail worked at the Kmart in Long Beach and I worked in Waveland, Mississippi. We met while attending a horticultural meeting at St. Rose Nursery outside of New Orleans. We have been together for 31 years.

Q. What were your occupations? When did you retire?

Gail and I both worked the majority of our careers in retail management. Gail retired from Kmart and worked several more years for the City of Pass Christian, Mississippi. I retired in February 2022 and Gail retired in December 2007.



Q. When did you start volunteering at Gulf Islands?

We started volunteering at Gulf Islands National Seashore in April 2022. We have only volunteered at Fort Pickens, but have traveled the United States, visiting over 12 national parks to included Yellowstone, Zion, Mesa Verde, Arches and the Grand Canyon. Our goal is to try and visit as many national parks as well as state parks as we can when not volunteering.

Q. How hard is it to get a position with Gulf Islands? The process for becoming a volunteer is simple. You go to Volunteer.gov and search through the current openings and simply apply. There is an interview process and if selected you will then complete paperwork for a background check. Once all is complete you will arrive at the location you selected and begin the work.



Q. What do you like best about being a volunteer for the park?

First and foremost is preserving the natural resources of the parks for future generations. By volunteering, it allows us the ability to do our part in achieving this. It also allows us to meet people from all over the world and share the natural beauty of our great Gulf Island National Seashore.

As campground hosts, we get to share all the historical information regarding Fort Pickens, as well as the local area. We also answer any questions regarding the campground rules and regulations.

As camp hosts we are the first point of contact with our visitors. We assist law enforcement with any emergencies that may come up within the park. We assist visitors with any issues regarding their campsites or issues involving Recreation.

There are also many other types of volunteer positions within the GUIS. Gail has volunteered for the Sea Turtle monitoring program for the past two years. We both have assisted in the GPS marking of all signage within the Gulf Islands National Seashore, which included taking measurements of all signs and pictures so the park will know what was there if needed. I have worked the campground office by checking in all campers and providing information regarding the park. We have also assisted with traffic control for the Blues Angels practices. We also assist with any projects needed within the park.

Q. You relocated to the north Georgia mountains after Hurricane Katrina for

more than 15 years but recently moved back to the coast- what prompted the move? Has it changed?

We relocated back to Mississippi to be closer to family. Although a slow process, we are seeing the Mississippi Coast rebuild with more family attractions outside of casinos to include the Mississippi Aquarium.

Q. What was your favorite destination on your westward trip?

All the destinations we visited while out west were amazing yet different in their own way. It would be next to impossible to pick one as our favorite since they were all so beautiful.

Q. Do you have another big trip planned?

We are looking at exploring the east coast from Virginia north to Maine.





Volunteer dos and don'ts

Volunteers must apply on www.volunteer. gov for positions. Please do not email the park unless you are interested in organizing a group activity.

Not all positions have housing provided - it depends on the position and park.

There are expectations and performance reviews associated with volunteer contracts.

Volunteers are treated the same as fulltime staff and are expected to follow the same rules and park rules.

As volunteers earn hours in our park the can earn recognition items to include the National Park Service Annual volunteer pass it can be an accumulation of hours from many parks.

Senior pass information for National Parks

An America the Beautiful - National Parks & Federal Recreational Lands Senior Annual Pass is \$20 plus fees totaling \$10. The Senior Lifetime Pass is \$80 plus fees totalling \$10. Ask about special discounted passes for military members, veterans and dependents.


The \$80 Senior Lifetime and \$20 Senior Annual Senior Passes provide admittance to more than 2,000 recreation sites managed by six Federal agencies, with up to 100% of the proceeds being used to improve and enhance visitor recreation services.

Who qualifies for the Senior Pass?

U.S. citizens or permanent residents who are 62 years or older. (You must have turned 62 before you can buy the pass).

NOTE: Owning property or paying taxes in the U.S. does not automatically qualify you for a Senior Pass. You must be a permanent U.S. resident, or a U.S. citizen with identification such as U.S. Driver's License, Green Card or U.S. Passport.



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1,000th Watchman Procedure Patient Phyllis Forte Finds Better Quality of Life

Phyllis Forte has been married to her sweetheart, Ronald Forte, just known as Ron, for more than 54 years. They met when Phyllis was 17. Since the surgery, Phyllis has spent her time helping around the house, canning fruits and vegetables from her garden, and enjoying her family.

"I have more energy now," Phyllis said.
"I've had no problems since the procedure, and I look forward to being able to stop taking the blood thinners." Phyllis credits Dr. Branco, along with the care team at




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Pensacola's Books by the Bay Festival returns in March

You're a single mother. Your name is Deidra. Your wallet has three bucks in it. You have an old Visa gift card with twelve dollars left on it.

Something bad happened today.

You reacted. You let your manager have it. You called him an awful name. You wish you could take it back.

You cry in your car. You wipe your face. Then cry again. You wait for your kids to exit the free daycare.

Your kids run toward you. There are kisses, hugs. You notice how tall your oldest is. Your nine-year-old colored a picture.

They talk loud and happy.

You're thinking about what's inside your refrigerator for supper. A few slices of bologna, half a liter of Coke, old carrots, two eggs.

You look in your purse. The gift card.

You drive to a pizza buffet. It's six bucks for your oldest, four bucks for the youngest—not counting soda.

You slide your card and hold your breath.

Life isn't supposed to be this way. You're not supposed to skip suppers and feed your kids with gift cards.

You're young, pretty, healthy. You're supposed to be happy. Instead, you're a few dimes shy of homelessness.

After the meal, you leave eighty-four cents for a tip. That's all the loose change you have. You're saving your last three dollars.

You drive. Your gas gauge is on E.

You're humiliated. That's how poverty works. It embarrasses a person until they think so little of themselves, they don't like their reflection.

You pull into a gas station. You're going to put three dollars into your old Ford Contour. Not a penny more.

You walk inside to pay cash.

There's a man in line behind you. He's tall.

Longish hair. Dirty boots.

He sees you throw three dollars down. He steps forward and says, "I'll pay for her gas." He places thirty dollars on the counter.
